means, right? Do you really know its full meaning and how old it is? Unfortunately, a number of Masons know neither the symbolism nor history. Today we take a closer look at an all too common symbol in our lodges that over time we simply take for granted. When our lodges are opened all minds and hearts should be tuned to the light and truth illustrated by the letter G and when closing the lodge, the memory of that divine letter and its august suggestions ought to be our last thoughts. In English lodges the letter G is not located in the East but rather it is in the center of the ceiling of the room with the lodge grouped around it, rather than assembled beneath it. Below is found the checkerboard floor (symbol of the vicissitudes of life). The floor is illumed with white lights showing us divine guidance and blessings so needed in our journey through this physical life. Also of note in the English lodges the letter G is illumed during the First and Second degrees but dark in the Third degree. Through the first two degrees the light is needed to guide

Through the first two degrees the light is needed to guide the candidate along his journey with the purpose of initiation being to bring God and man together and make them one. God becomes man that man may become God, a truth which lies at the core of all religion and more especially that of Freemasonry. No longer is artificial outside light needed as we have God within us and His illumination is now our guiding principle. Throughout history as far back as we are able to go, one letter of the alphabet was generally used as a divine symbol. In the Egyptian mysteries it was the solar Ra, a symbol of the spiritual sun shining on the mortal path. In the Greek mysteries at Delphi is was the letter "E" - Epsilon - the fifth letter of the Greek alphabet; which just so happens to represent the five senses and therefore man. Plutarch mentions that the letter epsilon was made of wood in the First Degree, bronze in the Second and gold in the Third which was to show the advancement and refinement of the moral and spiritual nature, as well as the higher value to the truth that was revealed. Unfortunately as is the case with much of our Craft, much has been lost to us. In our lodges today the letter G stands for geometry and also the initial for our word for God. Since all Masonry rests on Geometry, and it is a known fact that geometry is the way of God, it is simple logic that the two are interchangeable. That the G stands for geometry stems from the oldest charges of the Craft and is agreed that Masonry is moral Geometry. It is an actual fact that geometry is the thought-form of God in nature, in both the snowflake and in the orbits of the stars. Masonry does not seek to hide the fact that we rest in God, live in God, and seek to lead men to God. Everything about Masonry shouts references to God, every lesson, lecture, and each degree. Without God our Order has no meaning, no mission among men. For Masonry, God is the first truth and the final reality. Yet, here is an interesting facet of Masonry, we rarely use His Name. We substitute His Name with the phrase, The Great Architect of the Universe. Even though the phrase fits nicely into our ritual and symbolism, I think the principal reason for our infrequent use of His Name is we fear it will lose some if its awe and wonder if used too often. It is the same concept our Jewish brothers employ when we see His name spelled thusly, G_d. Recall, Masonry only asks that we confess our faith in a Supreme Being. It does not require that we analyze or define in detail our thoughts of God. True faith goes much deeper than words can ever describe. It gets into instincts and feelings and all attempts to put it in words are generally futile. I think the words of Tolstoy in his book War and Peace illustrate the point quite well. When the young count said with a sneer that he did not believe in God, the old Mason smiled, as a mother might smile at the silly saying of a child. Then, in a gentle voice the old man said: Yes, you do not know Him, sir. You do not know Him and that is why you are unhappy. But He is here, He is within you, even in these scoffing words you have just uttered. If He is not, we should not be speaking of Him, sir. Whom doest thou deny? All these things - all this history and hope and yearning which defy analysis -Masonry tells us in a shining letter which hangs in the lodge. It is the wisest way; its presence is a prophecy, and its influence extends beyond our knowing. Never do we see that great Letter and thinking what it implies that the message of Watts is not felt: O God, our help in ages past, Our hope in times to come, Our shelter from the stormy blast, And our
