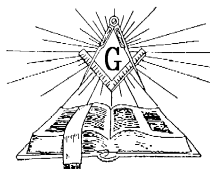

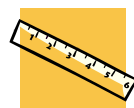

8. **PLEA TO THE “LOCAL MEMBERSHIP”:** Brethren, if you live in the area, I want to make a desperate plea to you to attend as often as you can. For the first time ever I am scared, frightened, afraid, terrified, petrified, worried that **“YOUR LODGE” (WEBB LODGE #166)** is dying a slow death. The Roster is down to 97 members. (337 when I became secretary in 1988) Yet at least 60 members are in the area. Where are you? Why do **YOU** not attend any of the regular communications? What have we done wrong? Have you forgotten the obligation you took during the degrees? I have spoken with many of you who promise to attend but I have not seen you. Why belong to any organization just to say you are a member. I have a saying that **“There are many members of Masonic Lodges but only a handful of Masons.”** Please try to be one of those Masons; Be **“One of the Faithful Few.”** So Mote It Be.
9. **GUARDIANS OF THE LODGE (Bro. Stoney):** I recently saw a movie titled *“Guardians Of The Galaxy”* and could not help but think of how we guard our lodges. Some of the characters in the movie reminded me of a few of the personalities we encounter in our walk down life’s path. So many different folks with a variety of ideas and goals all coalescing into a unified whole called Masonry. It then becomes our job as Master Masons to guard the West Gate from the unworthy who would come through via petitions and visitation. Let us look at the petition process first. The lodge receives a petition for membership and the Master appoints a committee of three to investigate. Do you count it a privilege and honor to be selected? The Master is in essence saying to you that he has confidence in your judgement and ability to discern fact from fiction. So, what do you do now? Well, there just happens to be a whole course on Masonic Investigation produced by the Masonic Education and Leadership Development committee. Unfortunately, you may not have had the opportunity to take the course. Could it could be you have not made the time to take the course? Whatever the case, you have been appointed to an investigating committee and the Master and lodge expect a report. By all means, make it a point to see the petitioner. Do not be satisfied with just interviewing friends, neighbors, employers and associates. Be sure to speak with any known enemies. That someone has an enemy is not grounds for rejection. Find as much as you can about the situation. Most importantly, do not be satisfied just because you do not find anything negative. It could be he just has not been caught and jailed yet. It is also not enough that he has no enemies, he should have friends, lots of them. It is vitally important that you determine the reason why he is applying for membership in our fraternity. There are many reason that would disqualify one for membership, such as a desire to enhance one’s business through Masonic membership, he simply want to satisfy his curiosity, or he hopes to make influential friends. These are not valid reasons for admission into the Craft. The petitioner should have a genuine desire to help others, a respect for the fraternity, a desire to follow in the footsteps of men such a George Washington, or fellowship with men of a like mind. Lastly, make up your own mind and then share your opinion with the other committee members. Doing your job well will not only guard the West Gate, but will result in “Master’s Wages”. OK, so we have some idea of what we should do when investigating a potential new member. What happens when the Master asks us to examine a visitor to the lodge? A couple of points to remember is that it is not an inquisition nor is it an opportunity for you to show off your proficiency with the catechism. First step is to examine his dues card and ascertain if the signature on the card matches the one on the lodge meeting book. Following that, we generally expect the visitor to recite the Tyler’s oath. A couple of things you should remember here. First, the visitor has every right to see your dues card and to look at the lodge charter. Second, the Tyler’s oath may be different in his jurisdiction. The object is to receive his oath that he is a regular Mason in good standing with his Grand Lodge and there is no reason known to him why he should not be allowed visitation privileges at your lodge. In conclusion, remember, charity of thought, toleration, kindness and courtesy are all Masonic virtues; and there is no better place where they can be practiced than at the door of your lodge for the benefit of the stranger who wishes admittance and to renew the Mystic Tie.
